## **VCE Philosophy**

Philosophy explores a wide array of questions about the universe and humanity's place within it. Using philosophical techniques and inquire, students will consider different theories about the nature of reality, personal identity, ethics, the nature of belief and what constitutes a 'good life'. Students will explore the work of famous philosophers on these topics and investigate how these ideas are still relevant to contemporary debates such as those surrounding artificial intelligence, gender identity, social media, cancel culture and fake news.
